• Advance Notice – Diver's Access Forum, Historic Shipwreck SS City of Launceston (1865)
This forum will be held in July for divers and charter operators to investigate the feasibility of a public access program for the historic shipwreck SS City of Launceston (1865). This intact and highly significant site has been off limits to recreational divers since its discovery in 1980. Following archaeological survey and excavation of the site between 1997-2002 Heritage Victoria is considering the feasibility of opening the site for limited recreational diver access. This may mean restrictions on diving season, diver numbers and entry fees for capital works such as moorings, interpretation and increased monitoring.

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
